University of Maryland Medical Center

Dr. Shere-Wolfe is an Internal Medicine physician with specialization in Infectious Diseases, Critical Care and Integrative Medicine. She attended the University of Pennsylvania where she majored in Biochemistry and then went to SUNY Stony Brook to complete her medical training. She completed her residency at St. Lukes'-Roosevelt Medical Center; her Infectious Diseases fellowship at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine; and her Critical Care fellowship at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York. She completed the Bravewell Fellowship through the University of Arizona Program for Integrative Medicine with Dr. Andrew Weil in 2010.

Dr. Shere-Wolfe has had a long-standing interest in Infectious Diseases and Integrative medicine. Her current clinical focus is Lyme disease and other Tick-borne infections. She currently directs the Integrated Lyme Program at University of Maryland Medical Center which provides Lyme consultations and Integrative modalities for symptomatic care. In addition to outpatient Lyme care she provides inpatient infectious diseases consultations for critically ill and surgical populations.

Her specific research interests include the study of integrative modalities for patients with persistent symptoms post various infectious diseases including Lyme disease and other infections. At the Integrated Lyme Program, she provides Infectious Diseases and Integrative Medicine consultations for a variety of illnesses such as Lyme, post treatment Lyme diseases/chronic Lyme disease syndrome, other tick-borne illness, post-infectious disease syndromes, as well sleep disturbances, anxiety, depression, and pain.
